I like Rosh Hashonah late, when the leaves are half burnt umber and scarlet, when sunset marks the horizon with slow fire and the black silhouettes of migrating birds perch on the wires davening.

I like Rosh Hashonah late when all living are counting their days toward death or sleep or the putting by of what will sustain them—when the cold whose tendrils translucent as a jellyfish and with a hidden sting just brush our faces at twilight. The threat of frost, a premonition a warning, a whisper whose words we cannot yet decipher but will.

I repent better in the waning season when the blood runs swiftly and all creatures look keenly about them for quickening danger.

Then I study the rockface of my life, its granite pitted and pocked and pickaxed eroded, discolored by sun and wind and rain—my rock emerging from the veil of greenery to be mapped, to be examined, to be judged.

The week of October 8, 2017 was one the most stressful and frightening weeks many in our congregation ever had to face. Sunday night a furious fire storm raced through Redwood Valley and Potter Valley, and also decimating much of Lake, Sonoma and Napa counties. Many barely got out with their lives. Week long evacuations re ordered for people and animals. Here in Mendocino Count a eight lives and at least 50 were lost in the flames.

Monday morning, as the fire threatened Redwood and Potter Valleys, Dan Hibshman his wife, Leslie Kirkpatrick and their dog Sam found their way to the Shul to bring the Torah in our care to Ukiah and to safety.

The end of this unbelievable week was Simchas Torah, when Jews everywhere celebrate our joy in the blessing of Torah. We had planned to celebrate the holiday in our Shul. Even though the blockade was lifted at noon on Friday we were unsure if we could access our Shul. We chose to bless our survivor Torah at the home of Carol Rosenberg in Ukiah.

Carol's house was filled to capacity with all of us delighted to be together and alive! All were not so lucky. To date, the Gitlin family and Ross Lake lost their homes on the Frey Ranch, Marlene and Gary Freedman lost their home, Efraim Turner lost his farm and Allyson Brooker-Rosbacht's home is still standing though unlivable.
