Dear friends of KHE,

The word "transition" is the common thread in essentially all aspects of Kol HaEmek as we go forward and are about to begin the Jewish year 5781. Transitioning with spiritual leadership, with the Shul School, with Board membership, and with our newsletter, the Shema.

We are all faced with the challenges of Covid 19. Since the middle of March of this year, we suspended all in-person gatherings, services, and Shul School. Our Passover seder was cancelled and we did not gather for Shavuot. However, Shabbat services and Torah study have been held very successfully on Zoom on five occasions.

Last fall, Rabbi Chaya announced she would not be continuing as our Rabbi beyond the current year, which ended June 30th.

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Rabbi Chaya expressed to us that a combination of regular travel over a long distance along with family challenges affected her decision. We were disappointed yet grateful for our time with her.

The Board considered how we would move forward. Before Covid social distancing, five members of the Board and two members of the congregation formed a search committee to guide us through our transition with spiritual leadership. We listed our need for a Rabbi in various publications, we read cover letters and resumes, conducted interviews, and we invited candidates to lead us in a Friday night Shabbat service and Saturday morning Torah teaching. After completing all aspects of our search, we were so very pleased to announce in May that Rabbi Meredith Cahn and Kol HaEmek will be going forward together!

Rabbi Meredith will be leading us for the High Holidays this year as well as monthly Shabbat services, Torah study, and other holidays. Her autobiographical essay was included in the May/June issue of the Shema. The Board also considered how we would plan for and observe the High Holidays. We contemplated many options but only one was acceptable. Knowing that the health and safety of our congregation is paramount, we will observe the High Holidays by continuing to use Zoom

Rabbi Meredith's leadership will be supported by Rayna Grace, a Kohenet (Jewish Priestess) residing in Potter Valley and Mia Zimman, a Jewish educator who comes from Petaluma. Rayna will lead Shabbat services and other holidays while Mia will lead Shabbat services, Torah study, and other holidays. Shai Schnall, a soon-to-be Kohenet also residing in Potter Valley, will be available to lead Torah study.

This past year a very successful Shul School had seven children attending prior to the shelter in place order. The children all bonded and became friends. We discontinued Shul School when the public schools closed. We don't know what the future holds, but if the public schools open, we look forward to opening the Shul School. Tzedakah is the Hebrew word for philanthropy and charity. So much more than a financial transaction, tzedakah builds trusting relationships and includes contributions of time, effort, and insight. We are appreciative to welcome Shai Schnall as the newest member to the Board. Our Board has 7 members. A full Board consists of 9 members. Full in the sense of having a group of optimal size from which ideas, proposals, and plans can originate and develop. As you all know we thrive in community. Our Jewish tradition starts with tzedakah, in service to our community. If you have energy and time, we need you.

We may need someone to replace our current editor of the Shema. Is this something you would like to learn how to do? To create a newsletter? Work with a variety of people, encourage articles on Jewish history and commentaries, invite stories and experiences from our Shul School, written by Shul School students, collect poetry, art work, haiku, recipes, ... the possibilities are plentiful. If you have energy and time, we need you.

These are from Sayings of the Rabbi's selected in 2011 by Harvey Frankle for a class in Jewish thought. They may be helpful at this time of uncertainty and chaos.

TOUCHSTONES: selected by Harvey Frankle

INTRODUCTION

The trick is to remember, after you descend, what you understood when you were high on the ladder. The guestion itself is the answer. You already have what you are looking for.

RASHI

Pay close attention to the obvious. The Gateways to Heaven are everywhere.

KOTZK

The choice is between love of G-d and thinking you're better than others. Acts of loving kindness restrain the ego by saying you are every bit as important as I am. The more people you love the more love you have.

LUDOMIR

The source of pain is in being torn away, in seperation. G-d made us to repair human misery. By doing so we neutralize evil and accept ourselves for who we are. When we say the vidui, the confession, we don't hit ourselves; we hold ourselves.

MEZRITCH

The goal of religious life is devekut, cleaving to G-d. Being in the presence of G-d requires **all** our awareness - there is no room for self-reflection, so you must cease to be aware of yourself. Allowing oneself to be nothing means that in the end the dishes have to be washed. Beyond nothing-to-think is life-to-be-lived. We are all messengers on a sacred mission.

NACHMANI

What people do matters. How widows or orphans or slaves are treated is the baseline of human history. The political forces that seek our acquiescence are counting on us to be afraid. Our fear is their most powerful weapon. And when you refuse to be afraid, they fall from the ladder. They cease to exist. When people behave as if their hands were the hands of G-d,then G-d "acts" in history. Everything is connected to everything else.

DE LEON

G-d and all of us are made of the same holy stuff. We are agents, instruments of G-d's presence. We are part of the Self of the Universe and to be aware of this is to give our lives ultimate meaning and purpose.

OSTROPOL

Wow! G-d was in this place and I did not know it was i! Look at the world, you are seeing with G-d's eyes. Look at your hands, they are the hands of G-d. Wherever holiness is awakened a ladder of light is erected that reaches heaven.

EPILOGUE

It is not Jacob who says "G-d was in this place and I, i did not know"it was us who are reading these words. We are the sacred text. The holy text is not "about" us, we are not even "in" it,we are it!
